COVID Red Light Processes – COVID Cases



We would like to say a huge thank you to our school community for the support and open communication we have had around positive COVID cases and our school processes this year. We are all in this together and we are so grateful for being a part of such an awesome



community.

It was ineveitable that COVID would reach us and this week we have been notified by parents and whanau that children from our Kura have either tested positive for COVID-19 or are close household contacts and are isolating with their family.

Please be assured that all information we receive about COVID cases is kept confidential and people's privacy will be maintained at all times. Any correspondence to parents and whanau from the school about positive COVID cases will be anonymous and only list the classroom the children with the positive cases are in.

Below are processes we are using at Kura to continue to keep us all safe while on site.

• We are continuing to operate the school in separate areas so tamariki from across the school do not mix while on site.

- Correct mask wearing is maintained by all who are required to wear a mask. We are finding now some children in Year 1 - 3 are also wearing masks. We have a good supply at school for children if they need them.
- Good hygiene practices are being maintained by staff and students.
- We are making sure all inside areas are well ventilated.
- Anyone feeling unwell at school will be sent home. Parents will be contacted about their children.
- We are continuing to ask parents to stay outside the school gates for drop off and pick up of children. We will continue to use the separate gates for this.
- There is no sharing of food or drink bottles.

If you haven't done so already, please read the Red-Light Phase 3 sheet that was emailed and put on Facebook on Friday. This provides information to you about what you need to do if you have COVID-19, are a close household contact or a non-household contact. It can also be accessed by clicking HERE.

MEET THE TEACHER (via VIDEO CHAT)

Due to the COVID red light settings we have not been able to hold our Meet the Teacher sessions as we would have liked. We will be offering a video option for parents this year. Links for video sessions will be posted on our Facebook page as well as emailed to parents.



Fetu o le Moana (Rooms 13, 14 & 15) will be having a

combined meet the teacher session this afternoon, Wednesday 2nd March at 5.00pm. <u>A link has</u> been sent to parents to join this session. Anyone who would like a 1 to 1 meeting with their child's teacher after this session has been held can make a time with the teacher for this.

Te Puāwaitanga o te Kākano (Rooms 7, 8 & 9) will arranging a time to hold their combined team meeting and will hold this when it suits most. A panui will be sent out to whanau. Kauri Team (Rooms 23, 4 & 5) will organize for a video session for their team in the coming weeks and notify their parents of when this will be.

A link will be sent out to parents for each of the team video sessions.

Is your child keen to have a go at field hockey? Come along to our Junior Hockey Huihuinga (taster evenings) in March and early April.



Hutt United Hockey is a vibrant Hutt Valley based hockey club with a strong focus on whānau and fun. We run junior teams for children from Year 3 to year 8. The training sessions and games are positive and fun, increasing in competitiveness as children progress up the grades.

Hockey is a winter sport, with the season starting at the beginning of term 2 and running through to the end of term 3. Teams practice once a week and games are played on Saturday mornings.

Hockey is great for kids! Playing hockey improves coordination and balance, builds teamwork, enhances mental strength and cardio fitness. All your child needs is a stick (the club has some to spare), shinpads, sports shoes and a mouthguard. Subs are \$95 for the whole season.

All welcome to our pre-season JUNIOR HOCKEY HUIHUINGA taster evenings! Just turn up! To manage numbers we're running *one Wednesday evening session per age group*:
