My child is a close contact	<u>No.</u> they must isolate from the day a positive case is identified in the household.
(within the household).	• Close contacts must be tested on day 3 and day 10 of the isolation period using a RAT
Can my child still attend school?	(Rapid Antigen Test) test.
	• If the test is positive, they must isolate for 10 days from the first day of symptoms or the day of the positive test result.
