During HuttFest (Monday 26-Thursday 29 June), Barbara Hay is managing the reduction of waste for the event, recycling as much as possible and minimizing what is sent to landfill. She is looking for family and/or friends groups to help.

Families of Year Six children were given first choice for camp fundraising: it is now opened up for all school families.



Making Space Crafts

We started off with a paper plate, then we grabbed and cut a paper cup in half and stuck both the halves to either side of the paper plate.

We cut some pieces of newspaper into strips and started placing them inside one side of the paper cup then bringing it all the way to the other side and sticking it into that side to keep it down. To make sure that it will be held in place we used PVA, because PVA never comes unstuck.

We had to stick strips all over the spacecraft until it looked something like the base of a UFO (Unidentified Flying Object).

We did at least three to four layers of newspaper. Next, we used a LOT!!!!! of white paint. We maybe did four to five layers of paint. After that we were allowed to paint it in any colour we wanted three to four colours for detail to be exact). I mixed pink, red, white and purple. There was a base colour for your ship that wasn't included in the three detail colours.

Now the part everyone was SO excited to do was the.......... ALIENS!!!!! The aliens were made with clay which was bought about two weeks prior to when we actually made it, and that's how we made our spacecrafts.

BULLRUSH
