# **A FEW THINGS TO NOTE**

- This promo code is allocated to all schools that are performing on the 26th of June 2023.
- Public tickets will also be released however these are separate from the ones that are allocated to schools. This means if the public tickets are sold out, the schools still have their allocated number in place.
- The number of allocated tickets against this promo code is 750 in total.
- Please note that the allocated tickets will expire on the 18th of June at 9pm, which will move all unsold tickets to the public sector.
