For tamariki who have been chronically absent they will miss 2 ½ weeks of school each term if they continue with this pattern of attendance.



Tamariki have been experimenting with senses and reactions over the past 2 weeks as a part of the science curriculum.


Te Rūma Iwa – Exploring Our Super Senses!



INFORMATION ABOUT THE NATIONAL MEASLES OUTBREAK

- Measles is circulating and is very contagious. There is now measles in Northland, Auckland, Manawatu, Nelson and Wellington, and we expect further cases across New Zealand.
- Watch out for symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes, and a blotchy rash:



Measles – Health New Zealand

- Anyone with measles symptoms must stay at home and should seek urgent advice by ringing their doctor or Healthline on 0800 611 116.
- Anyone who is closely exposed to a measles case must stay at home. Health New Zealand will provide individuals with advice on a case-by-case basis (including when they can leave quarantine at home).
- Health New Zealand is actively working with the schools that currently have measles cases.
- People are considered immune to measles after having two doses of a measles vaccine from 12 months or older, or if you have had measles before.

- 8. Follow the prompts to show that you've read the topic and enter your feedback if you'd like to comment.
- 9. Agree to the privacy statement and click "Submit review".

ROAD SAFETY AROUND THE SCHOOL – DRIVE SAFELY

We have noticed a number of dangerous driving behaviours such as

- driving up onto the berm to do a U-turn or drop off children
- people doing U-turns on the road around the road patrols
- using driveways to park in to collect children
- driving fast around the road patrols and school

These are all <u>dangerous behaviours that are putting children and</u> <u>pedestrians at risk</u>. Please drive responsibly around the school and if needed, park up the road or on Montgomery Street and walk up to school to collect your children.



TOYS

We ask that parents please remind their children that they are not to bring their toys to school. Toys coming to school can cause unneeded disruption both in class and in the playground. The only time it will be okay for toys to come to school will be if your child's teacher informs you this is okay.



2PM CLUB

All children will need to be booked into 2PM Club by clicking here Every Wednesday and Friday we run 2pm Club between 2.00-3.00pm for children whose parents book them in for this service. The cost of 2pm Club is \$2.00/session. This is to cover the cost of supervision during these times. If your child is not coming to 2pm you need to contact the office for that specific day. If your child is on the casual list and are attending you also need to let the office know for that day.
