AFTER SCHOOL PICK UP

First enter your name, your student's name, and your email address.

If you need to book for more than one student, change the "Book for x students" setting, and enter the other student's name.



On the next page, pick the teachers you want to meet.



Then you'll see a timetable showing when your chosen teachers are available. Simply click on the times that suit you.

When you have finished, your interview timetable will be emailed to you. And you can return to the site and enter the event code **47jnj** again to change or cancel your interviews.

Stopping on broken yellow lines, across a driveway, on a bus stop, and double parking are illegal and risky manoeuvres that endanger children and other pedestrians. If you choose to stop or park illegally you risk receiving a fine.
