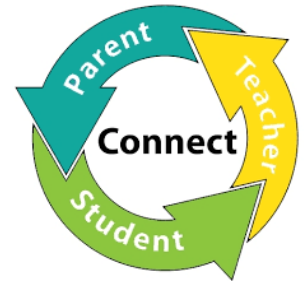

COMMUNITY TUTOR READING

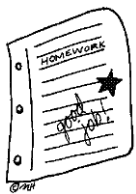
We are looking for some good keen people to help as tutor readers on a Wednesday and Thursday. If you are able to spare about an hour and help do some reading with our children, please contact the office.
