### **Planning and Organization for Alert Level 3 – Bubble School**

It was pleasing to see that we will be moving back to Alert Level 3 at midnight tonight (Tuesday 31st August). For the majority of our students this means that they will continue to work from home and teachers will continue to support them with this through distance learning.

As of this Thursday, Bubble School will begin on site for those students whose parents have contacted us about this. We have now set our staffing and are in the process of cleaning and setting up the office space and learning space for Bubble School.

For all children who continue to learn at home, Koraunui School will remain closed. Only identified staff and students attending Bubble School will be allowed to access the school grounds during Alert Level 3.

### **Key information about Alert Level 3 – Bubble School.**

1. We have set the staffing levels for Bubble School based on the number of students we have enrolled for this. We will review this should we need to after the announcement by the government on Monday 6 September. We will not be adding any more children to the existing classroom bubble before this time.
2. We will continue to provide online learning (and where required hard material packs) for all students. Further details will come out from the Ministry of Education on Monday so we will send an update regarding Level 3 arrangements late on Monday or on Tuesday.
3. Tomorrow (Wednesday 1st September) the spaces being used will be cleaned and prepared for Alert Level 3 Bubble School.
4. Bubble School will begin on Thursday 2nd September for students whose parents have contacted us about this by the deadline provided.

### **Communication**

We encourage you to remain in contact with your child's/children's classroom teacher in whatever way works best for you if you have any questions about their learning. All other communication can come to the office.

We will continue to communicate using phone, email, Facebook and any other means the teachers have set up with you. It is important that we keep in communication throughout the day.

Please let us know if you require any extra support or food. There are many organisations who are prepared to help, and we may be able to help with this. Most of all please look after yourself and your whanau until everything settles down again and we can return to a more normal life.
