Coronavirus (COVID-19) - Alert Level 4Update Wednesday 18.08.21





Kia ora koutou

We are now all in Alert Level 4 which means that our Kura will not be open from today, for anyone. This follows someone being identified with COVID-19 and who has been in the Auckland and Coromandel communities while believed to be infectious.

It is important we do everything we can to keep ourselves and those around us safe. Alert Level 4 means we need to stay home in our bubbles and avoid any travelling as much as possible.

Supermarkets, pharmacies, food banks and other essential services will be open – but remember to wear a face covering if you are out and about (even a scarf wrapped around your mouth and nose will help).

Check in using the **NZ COVID Tracer App** wherever you go, keep a distance from people you don't know and wash your hands well and often. You can download the NZ COVID Tracer App at the **App Store** for apple devices and **Google Play** for Android devices.

Government Advice and Information

Please go to the Ministry of Health <u>https://www.health.govt.nz/</u> website if you recently visited the Auckland or the Coromandel region. There is a <u>list of locations</u> the confirmed case has visited while they were considered to be infectious. If you were at one of those locations and at the same time as specified on the website, then please follow the relevant instructions to isolate and potentially get tested. Please keep checking that webpage as new locations may be identified over time.

Over the next 3 days we will watch to see what happens as COVID-19 test results come back from around the country and we will follow the advice and guidance of the Ministry of Education about what this means for our Kura and learning.

As a staff we are taking the next day or so to organize ourselves and our whanau. Should Alert Level 4 be extended beyond this week we will then move to a distance learning approach.
