COVID-19 ALERT LEVELS/TRAFFIC LIGHT SYSTEM



The Ministry of Education have advised schools that they will continue using the COVID-19 Level system

until the end of the current school year. This is to

maintain a consistent approach for school processes and to avoid any confusion for schools and whānau.

For us this means that **we will continue following the COVID-19 Level 2 guidelines that we currently have in place until the end of this term.** This means that our end of year celebrations will be held in different formats this year.



END OF YEAR CELEBRATIONS

As we are remaining at Level 2 until the end of the year, this means that our end of year celebrations and farewells will be quite different. All of these planned events will happen during the school day and unfortunately, we will not be able to have parents and whānau attend. Where possible we will record these and share them with our school community. This will include our Year 6 graduation, staff farewells.

We understand that this will be disappointing to some students, parents and whānau, but we need to continue to follow the guidelines provided to us as we work to keep everyone safe.

END OF YEAR REPORTS

End of Year reports will be sent home with tamariki on Monday 13 November. If children are not at school these will be held at school.

Vaccination

All those working and volunteering in schools now need to have had at least their first COVID-19 vaccination. Evidence will be sought for all those working or volunteering at Koraunui School.

HUTT CITY COUNCIL RACE TO 90%

We are proud to be participating in a *Race to 90%* vaccination drive between Porirua and Lower Hutt. The aim of this drive is to get 90% of Porirua and Lower Hutt double-vaccinated against COVID-19 to protect our friends, family and community from the Delta variant.



Both cities aren't too far off reaching the 90% mark, but there is more to do. As part of the *Race to 90%* drive, the Hutt Mana Charitable Trust and Hutt City Council have teamed up and will donate \$3,000 to our school - but only if our city reaches 90%.

Currently Hutt City is at 94% first vaccination and 88% second vaccination

We need to do everything we can to increase vaccination uptake in Stokes Valley. That way we can protect our community and the wider city from COVID-19, and inch our way closer to getting \$3,000 for our school. Once we get there, we plan to use the \$3,000 in a way that will benefit their health and well-being. We will ask the children for ideas.

Key points for parents and whānau

- **Must scan in using the COVID tracer app or sign in on paper slips provided**
- **Must wear masks while on site**
- **Observe 2 metre physical distancing**
- **Please do not go into classrooms**

At the end of the day, we will have three pick-up points to avoid congestion and to help us manage distancing at school. Pick up for family groupings - the oldest child is to collect siblings and then go to the youngest child's collection point or meet parents outside the youngest sibling's classroom.

- **Montgomery Street school gate – Rooms 12, 13 & 15**
- **Hall Entrance Gate – Rooms 23, 4 & 5**

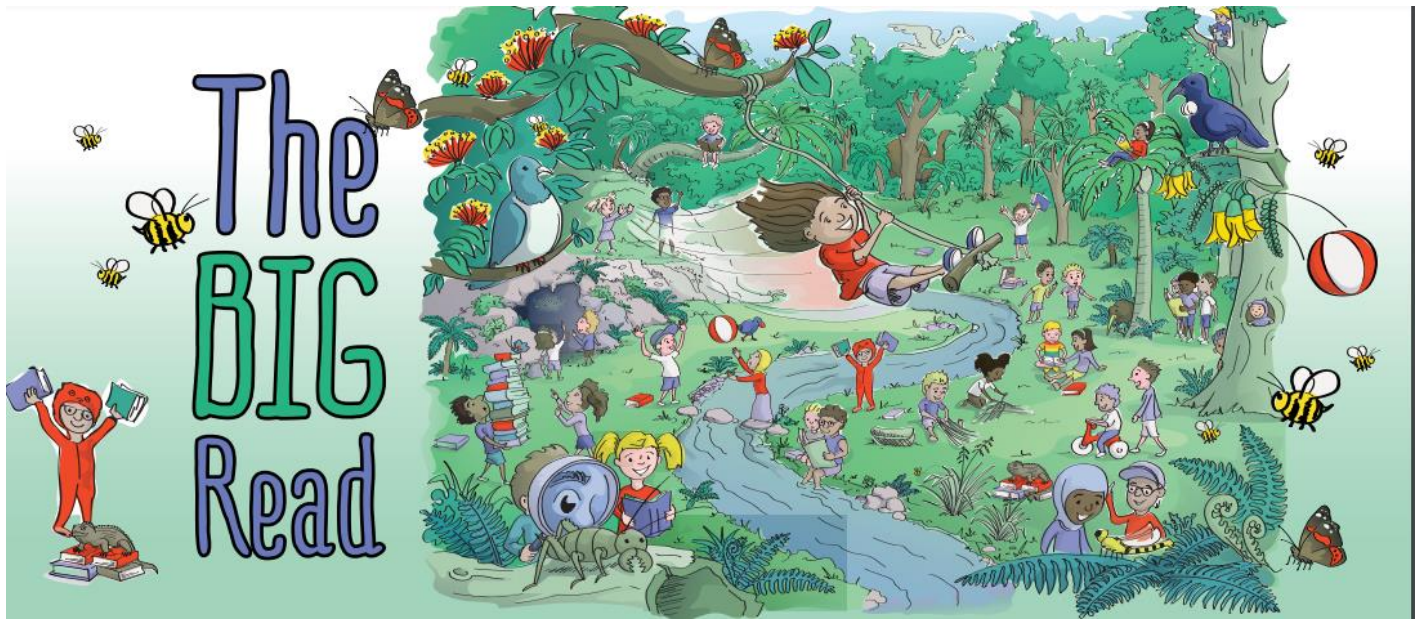

From the 1st of December Hutt City Libraries is getting tamariki excited about reading over the summer holidays.

How our summer reading challenge works:

- It is free! Tamariki aged 5 and over can pick up a Big Read Journal at any of our libraries; they don't need a library card.
- There are three levels, pihinga/sprout, māhuri/sapling and kōhure/tree. The number of pūrākau/stories and tākaro/play activity increases with each level.
- The journal is like a reading log and tamariki are encouraged to talk about what they are reading or listening to with library staff.
- Tamariki complete fun tākaro/play activities such as reading a book with a kaumatua or someone in their whānau or designing a brand-new cover for a book.
- Tamariki can win prizes for reading.
