
# SCHOOL INVOICES

# Homemade Tomato Pasta

#### About this recipe

This is a basic tomato sauce recipe that you can eat with pasta. You can also make a double quantity and freeze half to use in soups, lasagne, stews, shakshuka and veggie shepherd's pie.

#### Ingredients

One onion (chopped)
2 cans of tomatoes
A handful of thyme or oregano
Three cups of finely chopped veges (carrots, potatoes kumera, celery etc)

3 cloves garlic (chopped) Oil Salt and pepper

#### Method

- Heat a glug of oil in a pan. On a low heat cook the onion for 10 mins with a large pinch of salt.
- Add the tomatoes to the pan and another can of water along with your herb, pepper and 1 tsp salt. Bring to a boil, lower the heat and simmer for about 40 mins or until thick.
- Add your garlic 10 mins before the end of cooking. You can also add a pinch of chilli flakes at this point.
- 4. Serve with cooked pasta (or rice, or a baked potato) and cheese if you want. Add a chopped herb like basil or parsley. If you want more greens then add florets of broccoli or chopped greens to your cooking pasta 2 mins before the end.
