We are thrilled to announce Koraunui School's partnership with Stokes Valley Kai and to announce that we have a kai sharing shelf located behind the letterbox fence at front of the school. Our mission is to create a communal space where whānau can access kai daily and share what they have in abundance.

Here's how it works:

- Take what you need: If you or your whānau need kai, feel free to take from the shelf.
- Share what you can: If you have surplus kai from your garden or pantry, please leave it on the shelf for others.

The amount and type of food available will vary from day to day. Important: Please be considerate and ensure that there's enough

kai for others who might need it. The shelf will be monitored to maintain its condition. In case of misuse, we might have to remove it.
