MOVIN' MARCH



Movin' March Passports - All tamariki, have been given a Movin' March passport. The idea is that each tamaiti who walks, scooters or bikes to and from Kura will get a stamp. Once the passport is completed (usually after a full week of Kura) they are handed back to their kaiako or the office and they can et a new passport.

STOKES VALLEY KAI SHELF



We are thrilled to announce Koraunui School's partnership with Stokes Valley Kai and to announce that we have a kai

sharing shelf located behind the letterbox fence at front of the school.

Our mission is to create a communal space where whānau can access kai daily and share what they have in abundance.

Here's how it works:

- Take what you need: If you or your whānau need kai, feel free to take from the shelf.
- Share what you can: If you have surplus kai from your garden or pantry, please leave it on the shelf for others.

The amount and type of food available will vary from day to day.

Important: Please be considerate and ensure that there's enough kai for others who might need it. The shelf will be monitored to maintain its condition. In case of misuse, we might have to remove it.

Let's nourish our community together. Community feeding community.

2PM CLUB

All children will need to be booked into 2PM Club by clicking here

Every Wednesday and Friday we run 2pm Club between 2.00-3.00pm for children whose parents book them in for this service. The cost of 2pm Club is \$2.00/session. This is to cover the cost of supervision during these times. If your child is not coming to 2pm you need to contact the office for that specific day. If your child is on the casual list and are attending you also need to let the office know for that day.
