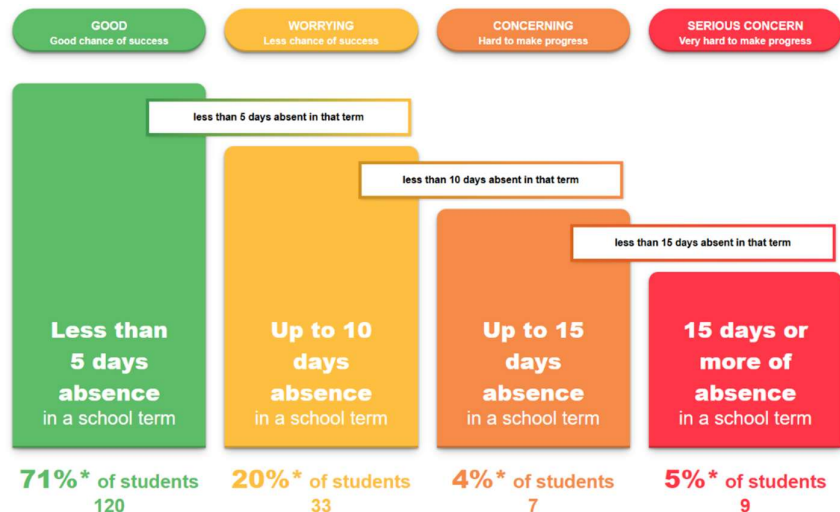
ATTENDANCE

KORAUNUI SCHOOL PARENT APP

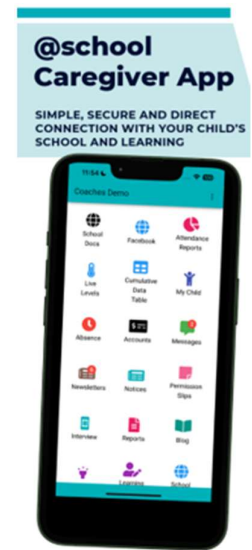

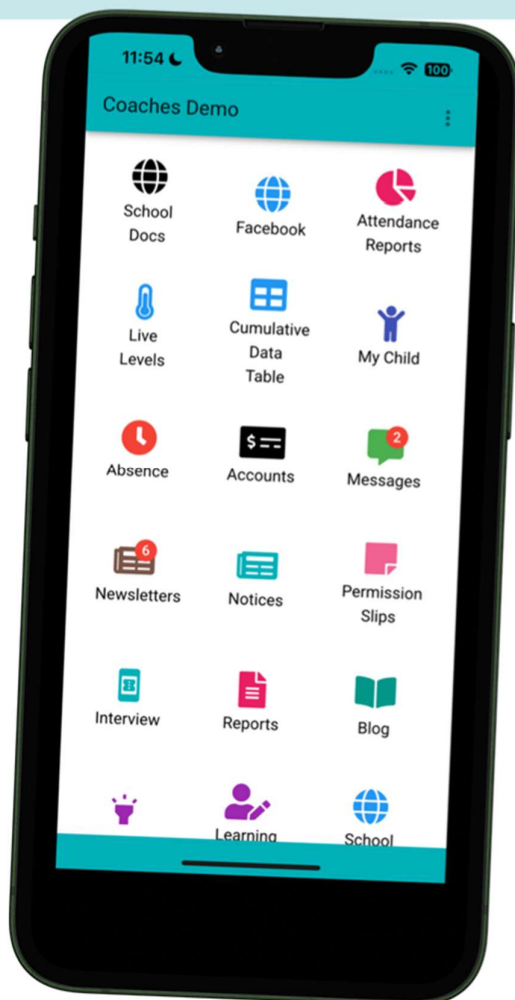
